Tour option 1: Vatican museums, Raphael rooms, Sistine Chapel and St. Peter's Basilica



The tour begins in the Courtyard of the Pine Cone and goes through the most beautiful rooms of the Museums with a succession of masterpieces of classical painting and sculpture until we reach the rooms of Raphael and Michelangelo Buonarroti's marvelous representations in the Sistine Chapel. To make your visit unforgettable we will conclude with St. Peter's Basilica, which can be accessed **without standing in line!**



The Colosseum (Flavian Amphitheater) is Rome's most famous monument and represents the first and largest stable masonry amphitheater in the world. The Colosseum is an admirable example of the architectural genius of ancient times, is a Roman amphitheater built in 72 AD. Commissioned by Emperor Vespasian, the monument could seat up to 65,000 people and was used as a venue for ancient gladiator fights.

With the visit you will also access the Roman Forum, located a few steps from the Flavian Amphitheater along Via dei Fori Imperiali. It brings together some of the gems of the Roman Empire's history. Monuments from several different eras are concentrated in a relatively small space. From the Basilica of Maxentius to the Temple of Saturn, from the Basilica Julia to the Temple of Vesta.
